

Presentation #2 – A recipe

This Week

1. Choose a recipe for something you like to eat. We would enjoy learning about a dish from your country, but you can choose anything you want.
2. Write down the recipe (a list of ingredients and simple instructions.)
3. Email me the recipe **by Friday, February 18.**
4. If I find any English mistakes, I will return the recipe for you to fix.
5. When I have all the recipes, I will compile them into a book. I will give everyone in the class a copy of our “ESL Cookbook” on Wednesday, February 23.

Next Week

1. Give a short talk (5-10 minutes) about the dish that you wrote about.
2. The other students will have the written recipe, so tell us other interesting things about the dish.
3. The talks will start on Wednesday, February 23. I will give out a signup sheet on Monday.

SOME THINGS TO INCLUDE IN YOUR TALK:

1. The name of the dish.
2. Does it have special significance? Is it eaten on a special occasion, like a holiday or a wedding, or is it an everyday dish?
3. How did you learn how to make it? (Or, if you don't make it yourself, who usually makes it for you?)
4. Why do you like it?
5. Do you need any special ingredients, pots, or supplies?
6. If there are unusual ingredients, tell us about them. Can you buy them in Milwaukee?
7. Can you get this dish in a restaurant or store in Milwaukee?
8. Bring pictures (or samples) if you want.
9. Students will have the opportunity to ask you questions.
